



6th Congressional District Poll Results
Dietzel 18%, Claitor 17% (Undecided 65%)
Dietzel 43%, Edwards 34% (Undecided 23%)

POLLING METHODOLOGY

Our philosophy about which population to use depends on the election, but we are generally comfortable with a “likely voter” model (as opposed to a “registered voter” model) for most elections. For this poll, we chose a sample of “minimally likely” 6th Congressional District households for an automated poll, and there were 581 completed responses.

The survey was conducted February 24-25. The margin of error, with a 95% confidence interval, was 4.1%. The demographic breakdown of the respondents was 78-18% white/black, while the party registration of respondents was 41-39% Democratic (20% Independents). The geographic breakdown of the respondents was as follows: 10% from Ascension Parish, 27% from eastern East Baton Rouge Parish, 19% from southern East Baton Rouge Parish, 18% from the Florida Parishes, 12% from Houma/Thibodaux, 5% from “the Saints”, and 9% from the Westside (*The explanation of the boundaries of these regions is graphically depicted in Exhibit A at the end of the poll analysis*).

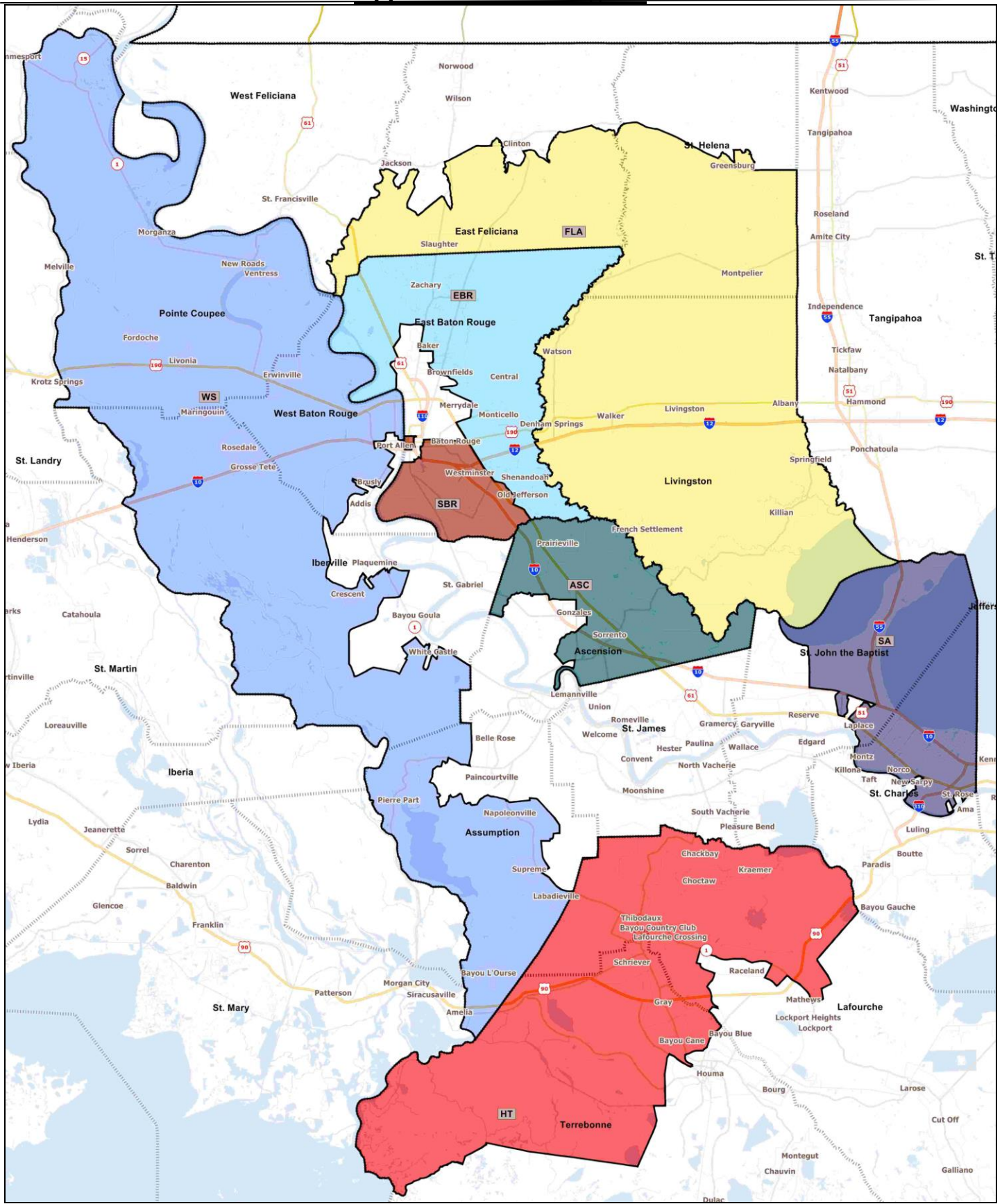
Question 4: If there were a runoff election for the 6th Congressional District and the candidates were Republicans Dan Claitor and Paul Dietzel II, who would you support?

Dietzel II	18%
Claitor	17%
Undecided	65%

Question 5: If there were a runoff election for the 6th Congressional District and the candidates were Republican Paul Dietzel II and Democrat Edwin Edwards, who would you support?

Dietzel II	43%
Edwards	34%
Undecided	23%
